Christopher Paul Catrambone is an American manager and humanitarian, best known for founding the Migrant Offshore Aid Station (MOAS), a global search and rescue charity. He was born in Lake Charles, Louisiana state from United States of America.





- In 2014, the illegal immigration of people from Africa and Asia to European countries was more closely controlled than ever. This meant that migrants began to make sailing trips much more risky, leading to the drowning of hundreds of people. Following a phone call to the Pope in Vatican, Catrambone and his family thought of spending millions of pounds to buy a boat and a supply of equipment and experts to help save the lives of migrants in seas.



- In the summer of that year, this man estimated that the number of people they carried safely was about 3000 men, women and children. They were taken to Malta and Italy.



Many years ago, he went to some of the most dangerous places in the world, including Iraq and Afghanistan, to save a lot of people. He says: “*I would give my life to save somebody*”.



In conclusion, he is a man of solidarity and tolerance. I believe that he is a role model in terms of his behavior and his maximum willingness to help the persons in the world who suffers.



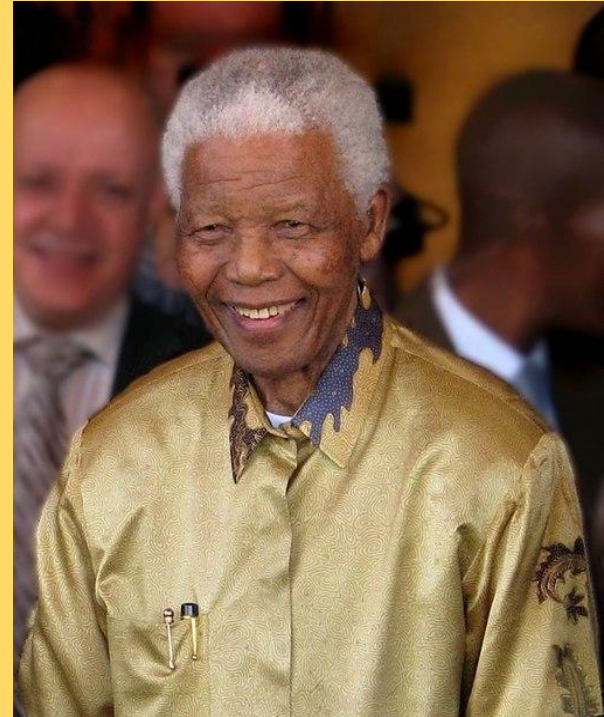

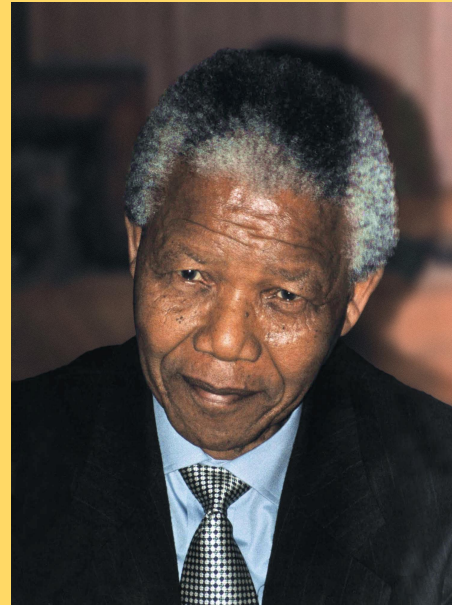
NELSON MANDELA

Nelson Mandela born in 1918 Transkei, South Africa, was one of the most important symbols of human rights. He fought against injustice, tolerance and freedom. For his ideas he was arrested in 1952 and pursued acquitted in 1958.



In 1964 he was arrested again and found guilty of sabotage and other treason. During his imprisonment he wrote a book and one of his most famous phrases was "I have nurtured the ideal of a free and democratic society, in which all people live together in harmony. This is an ideal that I live for and which I hope to realize and if necessary I'm ready to die "
